The Ulster Folk and Transport Museum is situated on the main Belfast to Bangor road, 10 minutes outside Belfast.

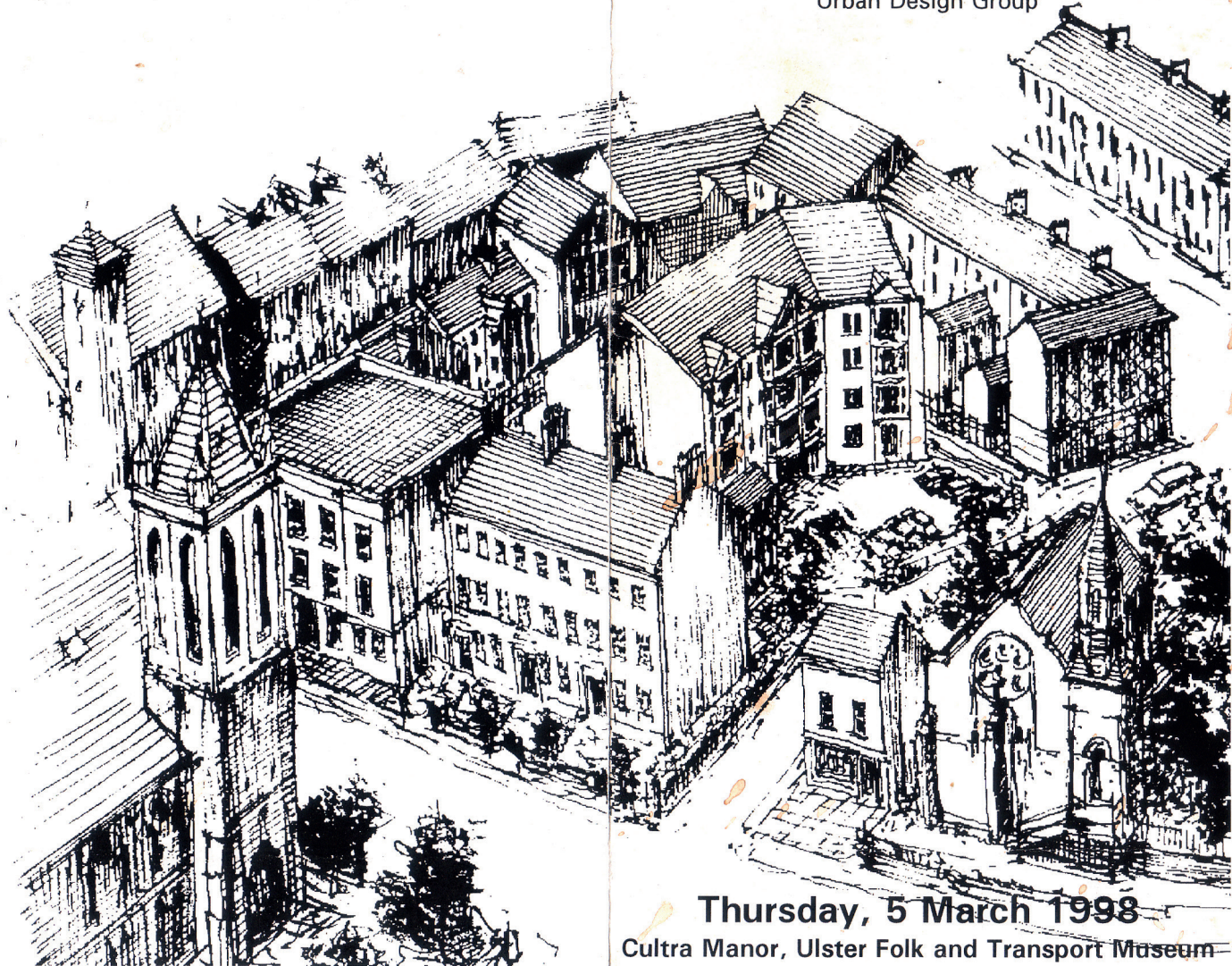
